		 Cr Pull noted that for Councillor panel that it may have been better if not every Cr answered every question to provide more time for questions and group discussion. Sasha noted that if there was some more rules around etiquette in chambers for students it may have enhanced the experience to ensure everyone is heard. Claire noted that it may be good to have a run down of the process before going into chambers to create a more cohesive procedure – everyone did theirs differently in chambers. Jen noted that facilitators who have not done YMC before could have been prepped a little better with draft paperwork etc. to be able to help students better. Cr Pull noted that there could be the potential for a presentation on meeting procedures or meeting etiquette to ensure correct procedures followed. Jonah agreed with this and thought an activity would be a good way to engage students to do this. Sasha noted it would be interesting to know what happens to a notice of motion if it is approved – where it goes and how it comes into reality. Even if it is a hypothetical, it would be educational to find out after going through the initial process, and what they can do or examples of how they have made an impact. It would be good to know the power of a small NOM. Nick noted that some years NOMs are brought to CoN Council and if they are then participants are notified. Cr Pull noted that NOMs can be a broad debate and go in many different directions, Cr Richardson noted sometimes NOMs have work going towards them indirectly by council, also. Cr Richardson noted the value of the YMC motions as an educational opportunity and an opportunity for CN to get a youth voice.
