City of Newcastle is proposing road names for four (4) previously unnamed public lanes in Stockton.

These roads need to be named to facilitate address numbering and to aid emergency service location and service delivery. Please see the below table and attached location map for information on the proposed road names.

Proposed Road Name	Suburb	Name Origin	Road Extent Description
Davenport Lane	Stockton	The <i>Davenport</i> was a wooden screw steamer ship that caught fire and was wrecked off the coast of Stockton in 1943.*	The lane begins at its intersection with Sylvan Lane and continues in a southern direction for 94 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Heather Bell Lane.
Heather Bell Lane	Stockton	The <i>Heather Bell</i> was a wooden barque vessel built in 1855 that was wrecked on the bank of the Hunter River at Stockton.*	The lane begins at its intersection with Fullerton Street and continues in an eastern direction for 148 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Douglas Street.
Katoomba Lane	Stockton	The <i>Katoomba</i> was an iron screw steamer built in 1878 that was wrecked in 1905 off the Stockton Breakwater.*	The lane begins at its intersection with Cardigan Street and continues in a northern direction for 74 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Heather Bell Lane.
Sylvan Lane	Stockton	The <i>Sylvan</i> was an iron screw steamer built in 1882 that was wrecked on the bank of the Hunter River at Stockton in 1924.*	The lane begins at its intersection with Fullerton Street and continues in an eastern direction for 105 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Douglas Street.

Submissions

- the grounds of support or objection.
- quote 'Stockton Lane Naming - November 2023' in the title of the submission.
- include the submitter's name, address, and daytime contact number; and
- where possible, an email address.

Please note: Submissions will only be considered that directly relate to the proposed road names.
