

Newcastle will be showcased to a global audience this summer as we host four games as part of the 2015 AFC Asian Cup tournament from 9 to 31 January 2015.

Newcastle is one of five host cities and the only non-capital. Our first game will see defending champions Japan kicking off their campaign against Challenge Cup winners Palestine. We will then host Oman and Kuwait followed by a semi-final and then the play-off for third and fourth place.

This is a fantastic opportunity for us to welcome our neighbours from across Asia to experience everything our city has to offer and I encourage all Novocastrians to support the tournament.

We are working with the Local Organising Committee and Destination NSW to attract international visitors to Newcastle as well as business, industry and education partners to develop an attractive program of events throughout the tournament to ensure the event provides an ongoing legacy for the city. First game in Newcastle is on Monday 12 January.

- Progress was made on city works despite severe challenges from ongoing wet weather.
- Construction of traffic calming devices in King, Wolfe and Newcomen Streets, **Newcastle** is complete.
- Works are nearing completion at the intersection of Northcott Drive and Wade Street, **Adamstown Heights**. The project will assist pedestrians moving from the residential area on the western side of Northcott Drive across to the **Fernleigh Track**. Upgrades include a pedestrian crossing, ramps, wheelchair access and bus stop access.
- Night time drainage work continues at Bridges Road, **New Lambton**. Weather and issues with utilities have slowed the project; however the western side is nearly complete.
- Major drainage works continue at Bar Beach Avenue, **Bar Beach**.
- Construction continues on 775 metres of shared pathway parallel to Wilkinson Avenue in **Birmingham Gardens**. The new shared pathway will connect to **Wallsend** cycleway.

ROAD TO RECOVERY



Option 1: Take no action

This is not a long term option. Taking no action now will result in a deteriorating operating position and the depletion of cash reserves. Whilst our actions to date have delayed this issue, it is not a sustainable solution. Our financial forecasts show that cash reserves will diminish to an unacceptable level and we will not have enough money to cover costs.

This option limits rate rises to the annual capped rate increase determined by IPART. This is forecast at 3% per year, a cumulative increase of 15.9% over the five year period.

Option 2: Fund financial sustainability

This option, as outlined in the 2013-17 Delivery Program, will retain and in some cases improve the existing level of services without depleting our cash reserves and ensure our financial sustainability. We will provide all the services we do now. We will also be able to improve infrastructure maintenance, reduce our maintenance backlog and invest in some asset renewal.

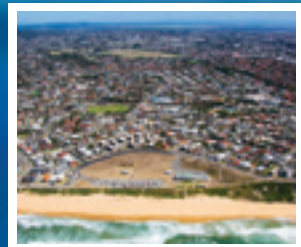
This option includes the forecast IPART rate peg of 3% per year plus moderate additional increases for a five year period. The annual rate increases will be 6.5% to 6.8% per year for five years including the 3% rate peg. This option will mean an increase of 22% above the rate peg – or 37.9% total increase over five years.

Option 3: Fund revitalisation

An additional option for consideration will allow us to improve current service levels into the future. We will be able to accelerate the completion of our priority projects as well as make substantial reductions to our infrastructure maintenance backlog.

This option includes the forecast IPART rate peg of 3% per year plus an additional 5% per year for a five year period. The annual rate increase will be 8% per year for five years including the 3% rate peg. This option will mean an increase of 31% above the rate peg – or 46.9% total increase over five years.

COASTAL REVITALISATION



Construction work on **Bathers Way** from **Dixon Park** to **Bar Beach** at Kilgour Avenue is nearing completion for Stage 1.

Detailed design is almost complete for Stage 2 Bathers Way from **Dixon Park** to the **Cooks Hill** Surf Club. Construction tenders are expected to be called in October.

Bathers Way at **King Edward Park** is currently at detailed design stage.



Construction work on **Bathers Way** between **Nobbys Beach** and **Newcastle Beach** has commenced. Shortland Esplanade is being converted to one-way (southbound). Work involves the construction of the shared pathway, a dedicated on road cycle path, cliff stabilisation work and new furniture, lighting and landscaping. *This project obtained a grant under NSW Restart, Resources for Regions Round 2.*

Work is progressing well on the rehabilitation of **Merewether Ocean Baths**, scheduled for completion later this year, weather permitting.



SWIM SEASON OPEN

Get your swimmers on!



The swimming season is now underway. It starts in the September school holidays and finishes at the end of April school holidays.

Seasonal patrols happen at **Newcastle, Stockton, Dixon Park and Merewether Beaches** while **Newcastle Ocean Baths, Nobbys and Bar Beaches** are patrolled all year round. Swim safe this summer and remember **no flag = no swim**.

All our inland pools are also open. We are operating **Beresfield Swimming Centre**, with opening times and entry fees available on our website. Lane 4 Aquatics have taken over operations at Lambton, Stockton, Mayfield and Stockton pools, visit lane4aquatics.com.au for all the details.

All Newcastle households would have recently received information about our proposal to apply to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for a multi-year special rate variation.

Which option do you think is best for the city?



Council staff make a difference in the community every day. Here are just a few examples:

- During the off season, our lifeguards provide water safety education to local schools. They wrapped up the 2014 program after talking to 13,857 kids in grades K-6 at 54 local schools.
- Our compliance rangers removed a safety hazard for motorists by capturing around 20 head of feral cattle that were roaming in the vicinity of Sandgate Road in Shortland at night.
- One of our waste collection staff assisted an elderly woman in Stockton who had fallen in her front yard, staying with her until emergency services arrived.
- Dozens of staff members were involved in the improvements to Merewether Beach precinct, including project planning, managing the tender process, community consultation, purchasing of materials, works on the ground and overseeing safety.

Council staff are working enthusiastically on countless projects and programs across the Newcastle LGA!

Other Councils across NSW have also been affected by financial pressures. Our neighbouring councils have had special rate variations approved, with Maitland receiving an increase of 63.2% over seven years and Lake Macquarie a 57.5% increase over seven years.
