Council News

Community Newsletter from The City of Newcastle



During October 2014, we asked for feedback from the Newcastle community about three rating options for the city from 2015/16 for five years.

These were:

- 1. Take no action and retain rate peg increase only
- 2. Fund financial sustainability with a 6.5 to 6.8% increase including the rate peg
- 3. Fund revitalisation with a 8% increase including the rate peg

Option two received the most support in the telephone and online surveys, and feedback from the other channels was more polarised. Two in every three community members gave their first preference to the options that involved a special rate variation (options 2 and 3). The full engagement report is available on Council's website.

At the 25 November 2014 Ordinary Council meeting, Council supported option three and an application is being prepared to IPART for a special rate variation of 8% (5% above the rate peg) per year for five years. The application is due in February and IPART will make a determination if a special rate variation is warranted.

COASTAL REVITALISATION

The Merewether Baths reopened in November after a complete overhaul. The overall appearance and access to the facility has improved, safety and maintenance issues were addressed and the pumping and pipework systems upgraded.



Construction work on stage two of the Bathers Way from Dixon Park to the Cooks Hill Surf Club is expected to commence in early 2015 and includes a minimum four metre wide shared pathway, lighting, furniture, shade trees and structures, landscaping, pedestrian access upgrades, and road and streetscape improvements.



Construction work on the Bathers Way between Nobbys Beach and Newcastle Beach is underway. Shortland Esplanade is now one-way, with works being completed progressively from Nobbys Beach precinct heading south towards Newcastle Beach. The next stage of works involving the embankment stabilisation overlooking Newcastle Beach starts mid 2015.

PARK SAFE, **STAY SAFE**

The park safe, stay safe school program has been designed to partner with schools, principals, parents, students and the broader community to improve road and children's safety around schools.

Common parking and road safety issues in school zones:

drivers picking up/dropping off on or too close to school pedestrian crossings

drivers picking up/dropping off in no stopping and bus zones drivers stopping for long periods of time in no parking zones drivers parking for too long in drop-off and pickup zones.

Parking officers will be active around schools from February 2015. The emphasis of the park safe, stay safe program is education and safety to ensure our children are safe when arriving and leaving school.



Strategy to guide land use planning throughout the city but what does this mean for you?

- Road work at Bridges Road New Lambton was completed for Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) ahead of time and under budget
- Pedestrian access work at the intersection of Northcott Drive and Wade Street Adamstown Heights (also for RMS) is complete
- Road work at Denney Street **Broadmeadow** was completed before Christmas in preparation for the Asian Cup

- Shared pathway construction at National Park Cooks Hill, Brickworks Park Wallsend, and Alder Park New Lambton
- Major drainage works will continue at Bar Beach
- Road rehabilitation at Bibby Street Hamilton
- Footpath upgrade on King Street **Newcastle** between Crown Street and
- Traffic signal works at Glebe Road and Smith Street Merewether and Glebe Road and Park Avenue Adamstown
- Transport stop upgrades including bus stop shelters at various locations





We're continuing to improve our parks and recreation facilities across Newcastle by upgrading our sporting facilities and maintaining our parks and reserves.

Waratah Park users are enjoying a new canteen and storeroom and will also benefit from new flood lighting this year.

A shared pathway is being constructed at **National Park** between Union Street and the footbridge at the stormwater channel, along with shade tree plantings, public seating installation and landscape improvements.

To kick off the new year, National Park No. 4 Sportsground, Mayfield Park and Blackley Oval amenities buildings will be upgraded to improve overall functionality and accessibility. We're also working on the design of an upgrade to the amenities building at Islington Park.

Other upcoming work includes flood lighting at Tuxford Park Shortland, irrigation at Novocastrian Park New Lambton and new fencing at Passmore

GUTTER TALKS IS COMING TO COOKS HILL


There are simple things we can do in and around our home that reduce stormwater pollution and improve water flowing from our streets to our harbour.
