



Stockton Works Update

June 2022



Specialist contractors completed the first stage of remediation work along Stockton Beach following the April erosion events. There has been regular inspection and monitoring while we finalise plans for the second stage of remediation works. These will target the crest of the Mitchell Street Seawall, south of the Mitchell Street Seawall and north and south of Dalby Oval. A new accessway north of the Pines car park is also being planned. Whilst ongoing repair work along the beach is being undertaken in the coming weeks, we ask the community to adhere to signage and follow any directions from staff.

Structures

Status of Seawall Upgrades: A rock supply source has been determined for seawalls at King Street, Mitchell Street and at the Surf Life Saving Club. The tender process has now commenced for the construction of the King Street seawall.

Protection Structures: The feasibility assessment and concept design are now progressing to detailed design for the protection structures at Mitchell Street, Lexies and north of the Stockton Surf Life Saving Club.

Sand

Harbour Sand: CN is currently working with the NSW Government on funding opportunities for Stockton Beach nourishment under the Federal Government's Coastal and Estuarine Risk Mitigation Program.

Sand Placement: CN has commissioned an Environmental Assessment of sand placement to ensure any impacts to the environment are identified and managed. This work is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2022.

Beach Scraping: Beach scraping went ahead on the 24 and 25 May between Lexie's Café and the King Street breakwater. The aim of beach scraping is to create a buffer of sand in front of the existing dune.

Extended Stockton CMP Development

CN has begun drafting management actions for the Extended Stockton Coastal Management Program. These actions will focus on short, medium and long term objectives. The drafting process will take several months to complete due to the extensive consultation required with government agency stakeholders.

Mitchell Street Local Centre Upgrade

Work is progressing on our upgrade of Mitchell Street. Construction and landscaping of kerb areas at key intersections is being finalised ahead of asphaltting the final section of road, between King Street and Crown Street. The upgrade is expected to be complete in August 2022.
