

SELECTION CRITERIA

PURPOSE OF THE STRATEGY AND INNOVATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Thank you for considering nominating to become an Access Inclusion Advisory Committee (AIAC) member. The AIAC provides advice and guidance in the application of planning instruments that prioritise access, social inclusion and overcoming discriminatory impediments to promote a highly accessible, inclusive and welcoming community that respects independence and human dignity.

SELECTION CRITERIA

Community and organisational applicants must outline that they;

- (i) Have lived experience of disability or;
- (ii) Are a Carer of a Person with a Disability or;
- (iii) Officially represent a community organisation delivering disability service/s and have two or more years of experience in the disability sector and;
- (iv) Submit a statement (1 to 2 pages) outlining how they meet the selection criteria and how this relates to the responsibilities of the committee as outlined within the AIAC Terms of Reference.

A completed application form must accompany your statement of claims. This form can be completed online on the [Advisory Committee EOI web page](#), or attached to email applications (available [here](#)).

CN welcomes applicants with lived experience of disability who also identify as belonging to other diverse groups and communities.

AIAC Membership

The AIAC will comprise of nine positions including:

- Three current Councillors with one acting as co-chair
- Three Community Representatives with lived experience of disability
- Three Organisational Representatives who work in the disability sector who may also have lived experience of disability
- One of the six external representatives will also act as co-chair.
