11. DIAP Update

- The now former NSW Minister for Department of Communities and Justice, Mr Gareth Ward notified Council via letter that an additional 12 months has been allowed for DIAPs to be developed.
- Importance of alignment with Federal Government Strategy and NSW Disability Inclusion Plan which both have not been delivered yet. NSW Government was to deliver the NSW DIP by mid 2021. Federal Plan has been out of currency for over 12 months.
- Steve shared with the committee a rough draft of an Action Table that could inform the final plan. This is to assist people consider what actions might be included and used for internal stakeholders to better frame what they see as achievable over the next 4 years. This is shared in confidence and not for sharing beyond this committee membership.
- Once internal consultation is completed, the Committee will have the opportunity to review the
 progress of the DIAP development. Please continue to submit any comments or feedback on Action
