

Moore Street

Birmingham Gardens Village Centre

Newcastle City Council have prepared plans to revitalise Moore Street, Birmingham Gardens with a focus on improving traffic safety, upgrading the village centre carpark and improving cycle and pedestrian safety and amenity.

The proposal includes a new formalised carpark, threshold treatment at the laneway exit, improved pedestrian and cycle connectivity, trees and resting spaces including seating, bins and bike racks. Traffic calming will also be introduced to Moore Street and Wilkinson Ave.

The character of the heritage cinema is enhanced with character style paving and the introduction of formal and informal seating.
