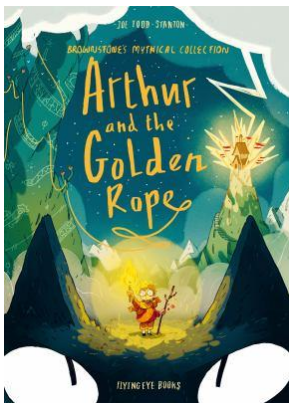


Arthur and the Golden rope
