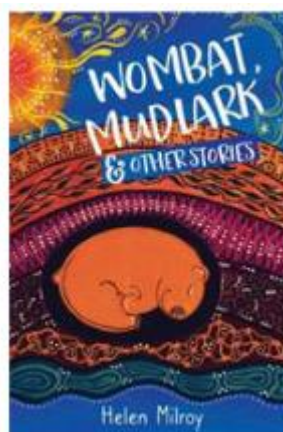


Sister Heart **By Sally Morgan**

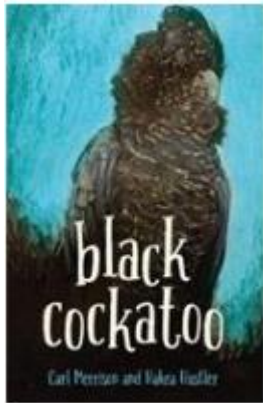


Wombat Mudlark and other stories **By Helen Milroy**

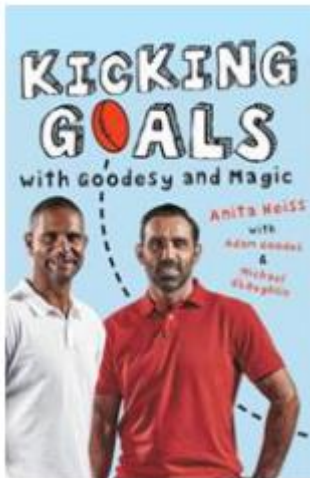

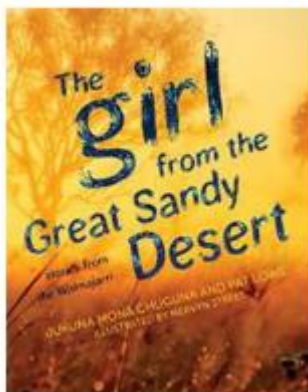


Kicking goals with Goodesy and Magic By Anita Heiss

The girl from the Great Sandy Desert: stories from the Walmajarri

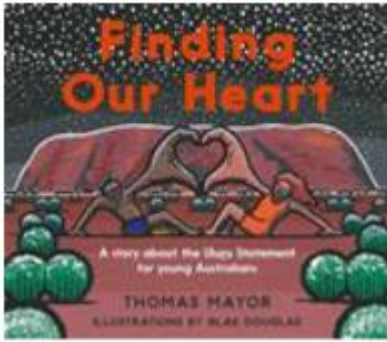

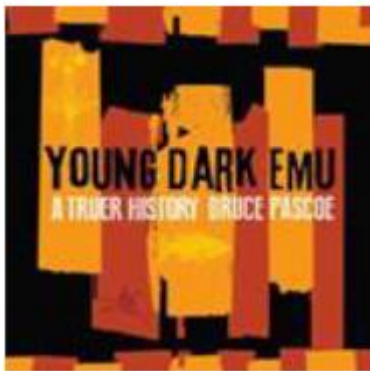


Finding our Heart: A Book about the Uluru statement for Young Australians
