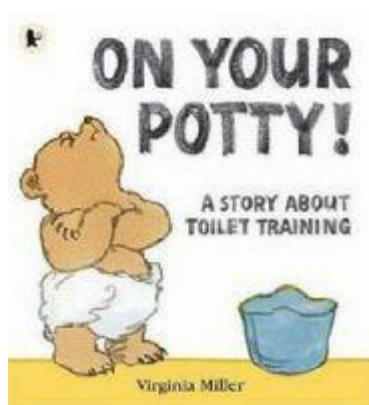

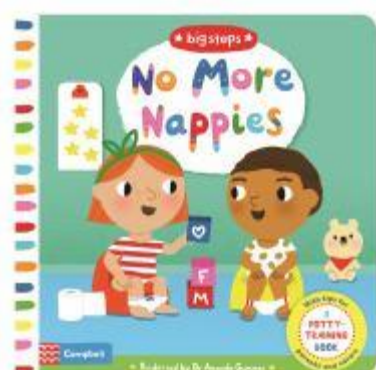


### **On Your Potty By Virginia Miller.**

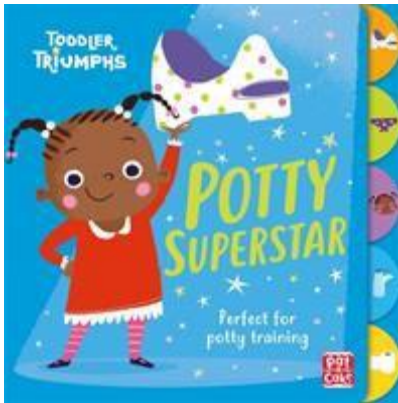
### **No More Nappies By Marion Cocklico.**

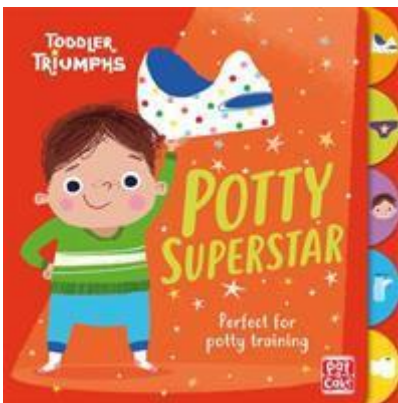

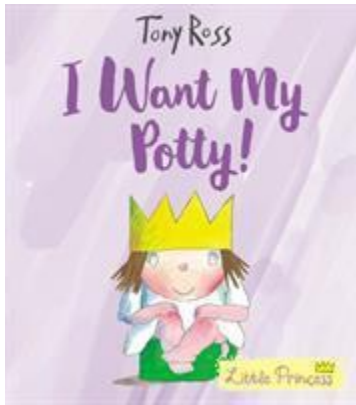

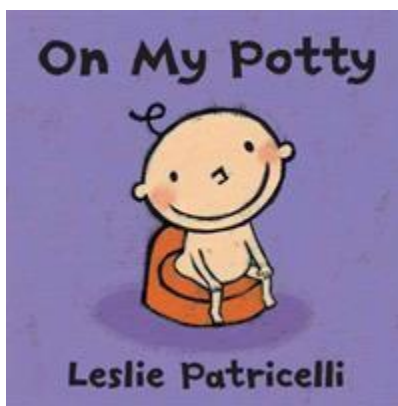


## **I Want My Potty By Tony Ross.**

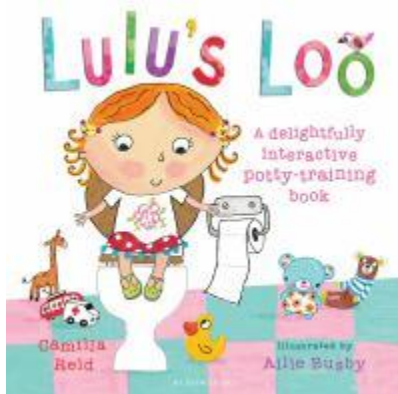


## **On My Potty By Leslie Patricelli.**

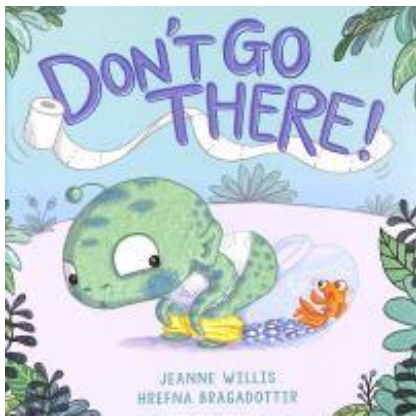
## **Lulu's Loo: a Delightfully interactive Poty-Training Book By Camilla Reid.**

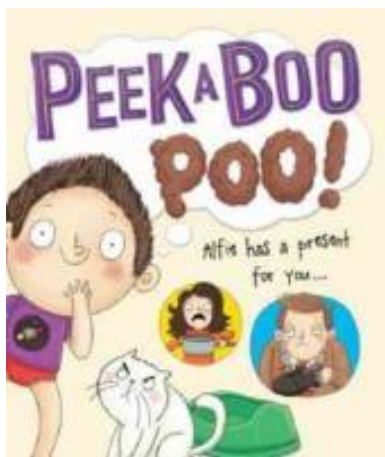


## **Don't Go There** **By Jeanne Willis.**

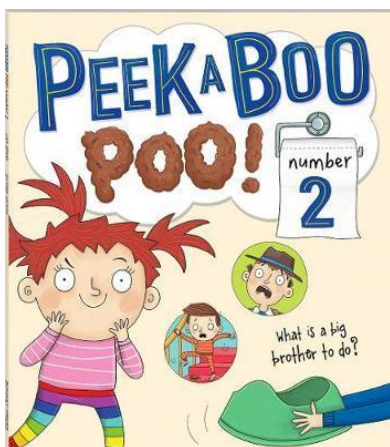


## **Peek-a-boo Poo!** **By Lisa Regan.**

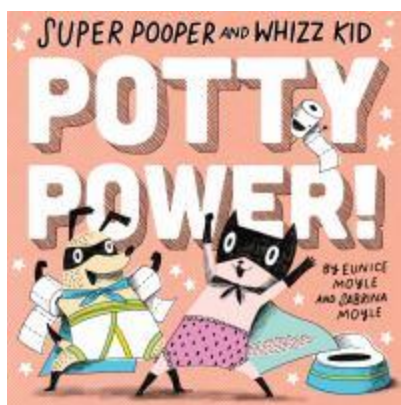
## **Peek-a-boo Poo! Number 2** **By Lisa Regan.**

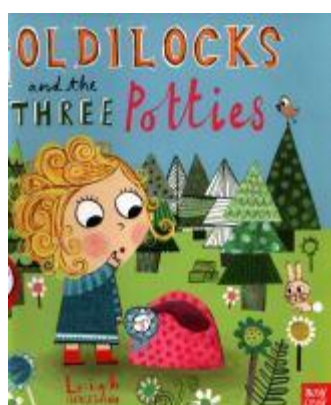

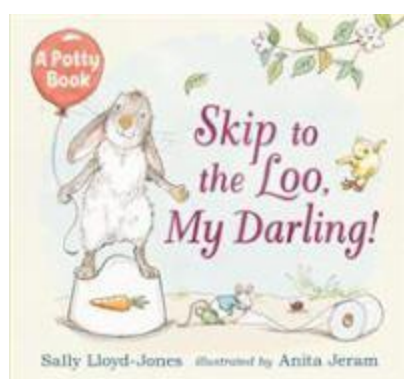

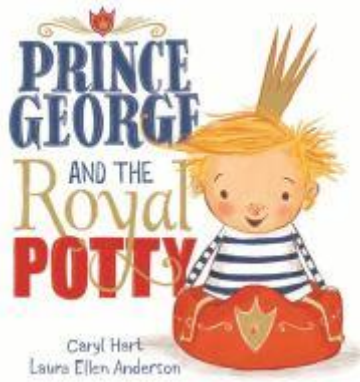


## **Skip to the Loo My Darling! A potty book By Sally Lloyd-Jones.**

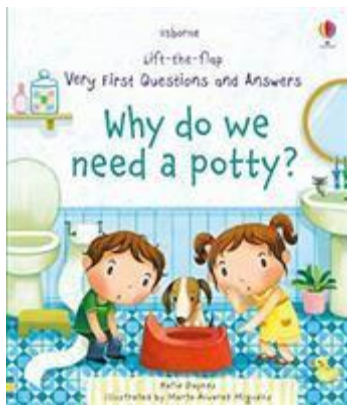

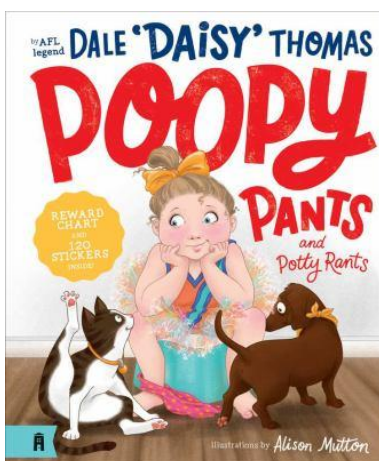


## Why do we need a Potty By Karen Wallace.

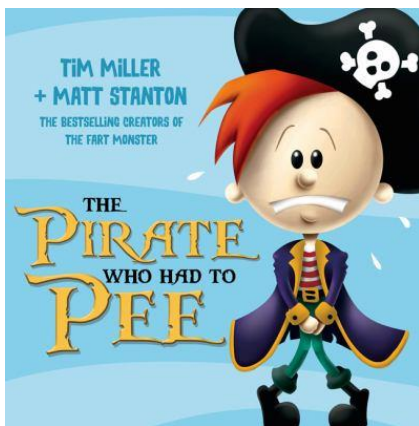


## **Big Boy Underpants By Fran Manushkin.**

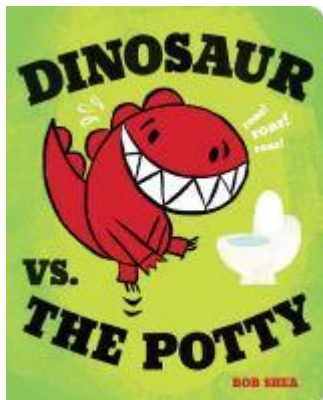


## **The Pirate who had to Pee By Tim Miller.**

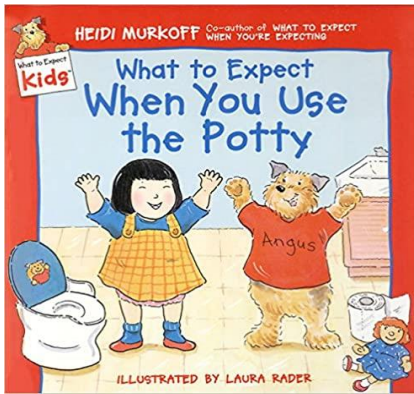


## **Dinosaur Vs the Potty By Bob Shea.**

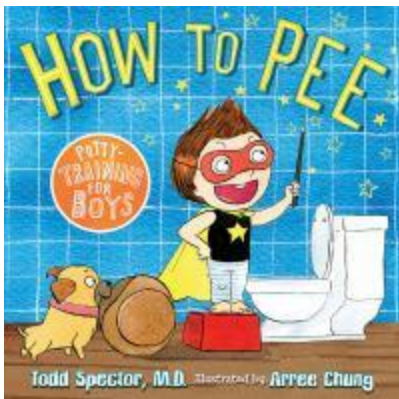


## What to expect when you use the Potty By Heidi Murkoff.

## How to Pee: Potty Training for Boys By Claire Cross.

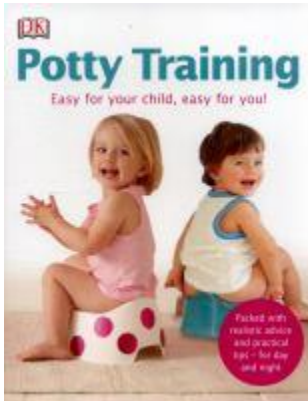

Abe would make up styles for using the potty, and we would try to guess what they were. Instead of worrying about when he would be ready or how long the process would take, we decided to have fun with it. The result was a lesson and a game that kept the whole family laughing. Many of Abe's styles included props-masks, swords, light sabers, hats- and we encouraged him to be as wacky as possible. He liked to pee outside, so we designated a few areas where he could do this in our garden. Of course, we also found ways to bring the game inside to the toilet. Abe was quickly potty trained and still, a year later, he occasionally comes up with a new style, using his creativity-and keeping our bathrooms clean." Dr Todd Useful advice turns the dreaded potty-training process into an exciting adventure for all.
